Those Moments, by TJ Cole, was made possible through a partnership with the Louisville Orchestra and its Creators Corps program.

Now in its inaugural year, the Louisville Orchestra Creators Corps transcends traditional commissioning and composer-in-residence paradigms with a radically new model for collaborating with symphony orchestras in the 21st century. Each year, the orchestra invites three creators to move to Louisville for the season, serving as LO staff members with an annual salary, health insurance, provided housing, and studio equipment. Throughout their residencies, they will compose new works to be performed by the orchestra, participate in educational and community engagement activities, and be engaged citizens of the Shelby Park neighborhood.

The 2022-23 Creators Corps cohort consists of Lisa Bielawa, TJ Cole, and Tyler Taylor. Each composed at least one new orchestral work that the LO premiered in 2023, worked on education projects with Jefferson County Public Schools, and planned an array of community engagement projects throughout Louisville.

Funding for the Louisville Orchestra Creators Corps program comes from a three-year, \$750,000 grant from the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation and significant support from the Owsley Brown II Family Foundation, the Owsley Brown III Philanthropic Foundation, the William M Wood Foundation, William and Susan Yarmuth, Edie Nixon, Ted and Mary Nixon, and Anonymous.


